In this role, you will be ensuring the pupils engage in learning and achieve by providing practical, experiential and therapeutic education through careful planning of the structure, methodology and delivery of the learning experience. You will apply your knowledge about learning and the modes of learning to plan and deliver aspects of the Steiner Waldorf Curriculum within the assessment framework of the National Curriculum in addition to their subject area. You will ensure the students develop basic skills in numeracy, literacy, ICT and the Core Learning Skills, together with social skills and will provide opportunities for students to practice and develop these skills, assessing their progress in accordance with the School's assessment schedule and Curriculum Policy.

- Experience of the National Curriculum framework of assessment.
- Have experience of working with young people with differing needs and destination aims, and developing appropriate strategies to help them achieve their goals
- Excellent communication and organisational skills with practical approach to engaging pupils
- Have experience of working with children/young people with special educational needs and learning disabilities who may be on the autistic spectrum
- Experience within specialist education and the Steiner Waldorf Curriculum are also desirable.
